NOVEMBER MUSIC UPDATE

Kindergarten students are building readiness for musical concepts through joyful, play-based experiences based on singing, creative movement, active listening and rhythm instrument play.

Grade 1&2 students have been exploring voices and instruments to create soundscapes for poems and stories.

Grade 1's brought the poem *Five Little Pumpkins* to life with instruments including triangles, sand blocks, drums, woodblocks, and tambourines.

Grade 2's used wood blocks, finger cymbals, sand blocks, drums, triangles, and tambourines to create sound

effects for the story The Little Old Lady Who Was Not Afraid of Anything.

Pre-service Teachers

We have welcomed a number of Pre-Service Teachers to our campus so far this year.

From Werklund School of Education, University of Calgary:

- 9 Pre-Service Teachers observed in classrooms.
- 2 Pre-Service Teachers are currently completing their practicum with Ms. Young and Ms. Hogg, teaching up to 75% under their mentorship.

From Ambrose University:

- 8 Pre-Service Teachers have joined us for their observation experiences.
- 3 additional students are expected to arrive at the end of the month for classroom observations.

We are grateful to our mentor teachers for supporting these future educators and for fostering such a strong learning community within our school.



Professional Learning

The leadership team participated in a Professional Learning session on the Pruning Principle, led by Simon Breakspear, on October 22nd. On November 6th, the Elementary Campus hosted Professional Learning sessions, which covered topics such as classroom complexity, the new social studies curriculum, mathematics, and technology tools. These sessions facilitated conversations that connected our learning back to Westmount's Mission.

Field Trips

Confluence

The Grade 4 students enjoyed a special field trip to The Confluence in Calgary. During their visit, they experienced *We Are All Treaty People*, a captivating performance by Quest Theatre that presented the history of treaty signing in a way that was both ageappropriate and engaging.

Waste Management

Grade 4 students recently visited Calgary's Composting Facility and Shepard Landfill, learning about waste management and environmental impact through:

- A workshop with a city waste educator
- A virtual tour of the composting facility
- 3 R's (Reduce, Reuse, Recycle) activities
- Discussions on conserving resources

On a bus tour of the Shepard facility, they learned about landfill construction, waste diversion, and composting's importance, linking classroom lessons to real-world environmental care.

Fall Walk

Kindergarten students enjoyed their Fall walks this October. They explored the Bow River Pathway searching for signs of Fall such as changing leaves, squirrels collecting food, and cooler morning temperatures. Using scavenger hunts and the 5 senses, they noticed pumpkins in the community, apple trees, and more. They ended the walk with a short break at their favourite Parkdale playgound!
