- We have a specific educational mandate; gifted education.
- Westmount rents space from the Calgary Board of Education (CBE).
 - We are not part of CBE in any other way.

<u>Please Note:</u> If high marks are the #1 priority for you & your child, consider this before applying. Westmount Charter School's #1 priority <u>IS NOT</u> high marks.

Many gifted students demonstrate:

 variability between their physical, emotional & cognitive domains

Heightened intensities

• inner experiences & awareness are more intense

Twice Exceptionalities (2e)

 Many of our students have other unique learning needs beyond their giftedness

All of these traits require modified teaching, parenting & counselling.

What does programming look like at MidHigh?

- Programming that takes into account both high levels of ability and students with asynchronous learning needs
- Capped class sizes and SOURCE class so that each student is known and has a positive connection with an adult at Westmount
- Opportunities to pursue areas of passion and interest is a safe and supportive risk-taking environment
- A community environment with like minded peers

Meaningful relationships

- smaller classes
- SOURCE class
- emphasis on relationships first
- less hierarchy
- strong sense of community where students can be themselves
- cross grade extra-curricular activities
 - mentorship
 - authentic connections
- supports communitymentorships between students



Admission Timeline



February to March, 2026

Application review process by the Westmount MidHigh Intake committee.



late March - mid April, 2026

All applicants primary contacts will be contacted via PowerSchool Enrollment and/or by our Admissions Coordinator.

April - June, 2026

Offers may continue to be sent out depending on current spot available and declines of initial offers.



September 2026

All 2026-2027 applications are filed and closed.

New applications will open for the 2027-2028 school year.

Administrative Procedure 300: Student Selection

- 1.3 "Parents are obliged to share <u>all</u> known information respecting the suitability of their children for the school's program, including any pre-existing and/or diagnosed medical, social-emotional and/or educational needs. Failure to disclose such information may lead to disqualification."
- 1.7 "Any attempt on behalf of an applicant to influence the impartiality of the selection process will result in disqualification of the applicant."
- "2.2.1 "When the number of students qualifying for admission to the school is greater than the number of available positions, placement will be offered to students identified by the assessment process as most demonstrating characteristics of giftedness appropriate to the school's program."

Yearly Application & Admission numbers

Middle school (grade 5-8):

Applications: 60-100 per grade

Offers:

Grade 5: approx 12-15 spots

Grade 6: approx 0-5 spots

Grade 7: approx 4-8 spots

Grade 8: approx 0-5 spots

High school (grade 9-12):

Applications: 25 per grade; lower at grade 11 & 12

Offers:

Grade 9: 10-30 spots

Grade 10: 10-20 spots

Grade 11 & 12: minimal

What does "most likely to thrive within Westmount's Charter" mean?

We use the following documents:

- Results and recommendations of the psychological assessment.
- Results of the Student and Parent Overexcitability Questionnaires.
- Information provided in past report cards and IPPs
- Information provided by parents in the Why Westmount.

In addition:

- Other significant factors of student need included in the application package.
- Please note that all these factors must be disclosed at the time of application.

In consideration of all factors, one candidate will be chosen over another candidate if they are more likely to thrive in Westmount's program. This does not mean your child doesn't meet our criteria; it means another child demonstrates meeting our criteria to a greater extent.

<u>Important things to note:</u>

- Westmount Charter School consistently receives more applications than available spots
- As a result, your child may qualify to attend Westmount, but may be placed on a list of qualified candidates
- If your child does not qualify to attend westmount, their application will be discontinued
- Please note: being placed on a waiting list of qualified candidates does not guarantee eventual placement.
