





HIGHLIGHTS

Kindergarten - Developing a steady beat through songs, rhymes and singing games, as well as singing about penguins and doing The Penguin Polka.



Grade 1 - Developing aural awareness of melodic and rhythmic concepts through songs, singing games, and movement. Some favourites are Bluebird, Bow Wow Wow, We are Dancing in the Forest and Apple Tree.



Grade 2 - Working on aurally identifying melodic contour and pitches through a variety of songs and singing games. Students learned a new rhythmic concept with Tideo, a lively double circle movement game.

Grade 3 - Students had fun learning a hand clapping game Double Double This This which also reinforced new rhythmic learning.



Grade 4 students worked hard to learn *This is Me* from the Greatest Showman. Their performance at the Inside Out Assembly was beautiful and sung with heartfelt conviction. Way to go!



January House Colour Challenge


The January House colour challenge centered on the theme of goal setting, encouraging students to reflect on their goals for the new year.






URSTRONG WORKSHOPS - Coming Soon!
