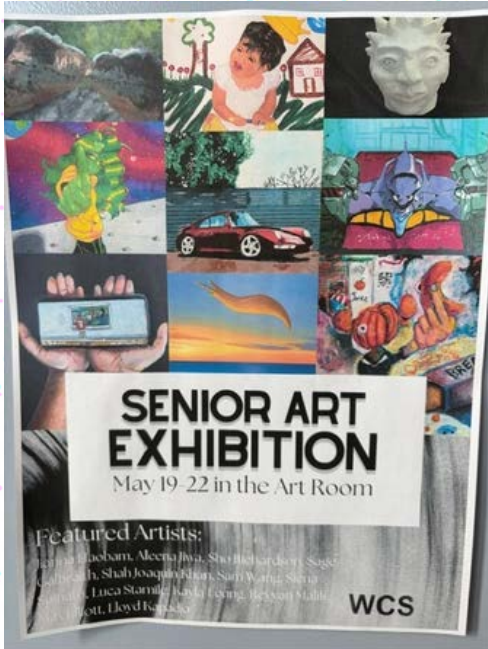
Grade 8 Integrated Project

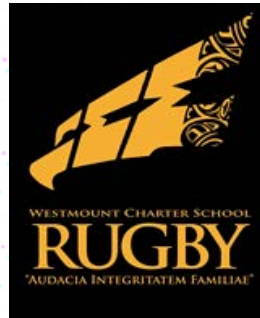
